## What you missed at the February Division Meeting JMRI OPERATIONS PRO

Jim Glenn of Division 9 of the North Central Region presented JMRI Operations Pro. Jim covered the various parts of Operation Pro including: Settings; Locations; Cars; Engines; Routes and Trains. Jim discussed some of the decisions you will need to make when using Operations Pro, such as, naming your railroad, direction of train travel (e.g., North & south or East & West), what scale you are using, and number of engines, the maximum length of your trains, car types (AAR or car description), year you model (optional), and if you want to add Operations to the main menu of the program. The next step is building your database, which includes cars, locations, locomotives, routes, trains and schedule (optional). Jim then discussed each of these items in detail, The advantages of using JMRI Operations Pro is 1) it is free, 2) the developers and users are always willing to help, 3) there is no limit to the operations on your layout and 4) you can write your own code to meet your specific needs.
