




CLAMPS (Part 1, By Chuck Hart)

I have mentioned before about an email group that Ron Christensen, MMR runs. There are about 45 folks on the email list and a wealth of information is shared on a daily basis. This week Ron shared a blog by Lester Breuer (http://mnrailroadcab100.blogspot.com/). The subject of the day was sanding sticks. I thought I would share a little about the many types of clamps that are used in our modeling. This is by no means an exhaustive list but covers a wide variety for you to consider. In Part 2 we'll look at some of the larger items used to hold things. If you have special or favorite clamps not shown here let us know about them.






ABOVE: Probably the two most common clamps found on our workbench are the Clothespin style in the left photo and the Self Closing Tweezers and Forceps in the right photo. Wood clothespins can be reconfigured and shaped in many ways for a particular application.





ABOVE: Next on the workbench we'll probably see some Bar Clamps in the left photo, both plastic and brass are available and next in the right photo an assortment of tiny plastic and metal Spring Clamps and Alligator Clips. The blue Bar Clamps are from EXCEL and are very reasonable. The brass Bar Clamp is a little more expensive! The small clamps are commonly called Sewing Clips. The clip with the long shaft is from MR. HOBBY and is used to hold parts during airbrush painting and the stem can be inserted into a foam block during part drying.

ABOVE: We may also find Rubber Bands on the workbench in the photo at left. Technically not a mechanical clamp, rubber bands can be useful to hold irregular parts together while the glue is setting. I usually use them during structure construction for holding a roof in place while the glue is curing. Probably less common are small Vice Grips, center photo and Paintbrush Clamps, right photo. The vice grips shown here are 4-5 inches long. I usually have the paintbrush clamps attached to the hood on my paint booth. There is a magnet housed in the clamp body that allows a metal object holding a freshly painted part to be placed on the magnet while drying. See Page 6 for additional information about clamps. Next time in Part 2 we'll look at some larger clamps that are suitable and handy during layout construction.
